The project is part of the hotel's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) effort to reduce and target zero waste management and adopt a more sustainable hotel practice that will benefit our mother earth. Volunteered employees used recycled plastics to make containers and plant seeds such as Eggplant, Lettuce, Ginger, Mongo beans, Rosemary, Indigo, Red cherry, Aloe Vera, and several other types of vegetables. The produced products will then be shared with the entire Boracay community.


ROOFTOP AQUAPONICS

Joy-Nostalg Hotel & Suites Manila

A new addition to Joy~Nostalg Manila's rooftop venue furnished with repurposed materials, the hotel has recently installed an aquaponics system for their budding rooftop garden. Seedlings include tomatoes, basil, mint and other herbs. There are also plans for more varieties of edible herbs and vegetables to be added in the future.

The current residents of the aquaponics area are young tilapia fingerlings and one juvenile tilapia nicknamed 'Jerry' by hotel staff.





LOW-EMMISIVITY WINDOWS

Joy-Nostalg Hotel & Suites Manila

Using low-emissivity glass panels, Joy~Nostalg Manila's windows minimize the passage of heat, reducing energy consumption of the hotel's air-conditioning system by 30%.

Low-emissivity glass affects the amount of infrared and ultraviolet light that passes through glass via a microscopically thin coating that reflects heat.

BAMBOO POTS

Mövenpick Hotel Mactan Island Cebu

Functional design meets eco-purpose at Movenpick Hotel Mactan Island Cebu. The resort fashions its commitment to green and sustainable tourism by using only eco-friendly furnishings around the property, such as the bamboo pots that hold the pails from which guests collect water to wash off sand from their feet. These sturdy pots help prolong the durability of the recycled pails, preventing them from going to waste.

Bamboo is considered one of the most sustainable and renewable materials. Aside from its versatility and durability, bamboo is grown without use of pesticides and chemicals that harm the environment.
