MEET THE NATIVE PLANTS THAT CALL CHONBURI HOME



Beyond the beaches and bright lights, Pattaya hides a greener side — one filled with wild blooms, tropical scents, and stories rooted in Thai nature. Take a moment to wander off the main road and meet some native plants that make the eastern coast truly alive.



#### Kaempferia chonburiensis (Chonburi Ginger)

**Where:** Forest paths near Khao Chi Chan, Nong Nooch Tropical Garden A rare wild ginger discovered right here in Chonburi! Its lilac-purple flowers appear after the rain — tiny bursts of color close to the forest floor.

### Wrightia religiosa (Water Jasmine)

**Where:** Naklua, Sattahip temple gardens, and quiet canals Soft white petals, a calming fragrance, and gentle branches that sway in the breeze — the Water Jasmine is often planted for meditation and serenity.

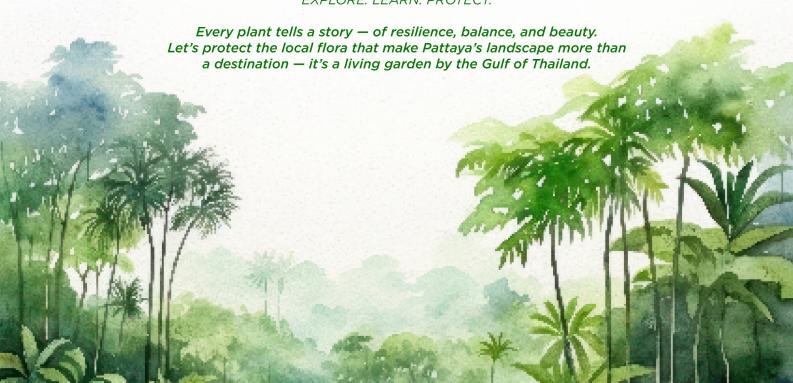




### Globba winitii (Dancing Ladies Ginger)

**Where:** Shaded forest trails of Banglamung and Khao Mai Kaew Look for its elegant purple and yellow "dancers" beneath the trees. Locals say these blooms resemble graceful Thai dancers — a hidden show in nature.

**WHERE:** Khao Chi Chan, Wat Yansangwararam
Curious and playful — you'll spot them near temples and forest trails.
